

KINGDOM MANDATE

Upon the horizon, a new day has dawned. A new era has begun. Unquestionably, at LWCC, we are experiencing a fresh, new move of the Spirit of God. These two terms together are used over one hundred times in the gospels! Jesus said, "Seek first His Kingdom and His righteousness." (Matt. 6:33). He taught His disciples to pray, "Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done." (Matt 6:10). After His resurrection, Jesus presented Himself alive with many infallible proofs, "appearing to them over a period of forty days, and speaking of the things concerning the Kingdom of God." (Acts 1:3). The subject of the Kingdom of God was important enough that Jesus said we should seek it first and pray for its coming.

The Kingdom of God is a major theme throughout the Bible. Jesus began His earthly

ministry proclaiming the arrival of the Kingdom of Heaven. (Matt. 4:17). During His final days before His ascension, He taught concerning the Kingdom of God. The Early Church taught and preached from a Kingdom perspective. In fact, we are commissioned to preach the gospel of the Kingdom in all the world before the end comes. (Matt. 24:14).

Jesus Christ came into this world to establish His Kingdom and not a religion. His Church is His governmental body on earth and is called to have dominion over all the works of His hands. Religion has robbed the Church of Her divine authority and dominion, causing Her to forsake Her former positions of influence. For many, church goes on as usual with the same predicable normalcy each week. In such, we may be attempting to keep alive the old creation and paradigm of church from our former chaotic thinking. Our concepts are being lovingly challenged as to what the Church is and what it is not.

All patterns for life on earth and every part of the relevant functionality of Kingdom focus and purpose is simply translated into the Kingdom of God – His will being done in earth as it is in heaven. At LWCC, we have a Kingdom Mandate to be a visible demonstration of the Kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven, where Kingdom truths, values, principles, priorities, and ethics are not only taught, but embraced, believed, and initiated in life every day.

I believe the Spirit of God is summoning God's people to be united in faith and bring Kingdom transformation in today's culture and in the marketplace; invading the power centers of our nation and restoring righteousness and justice, that the blessings of God may once again be upon our land. "When you came in here, you're no longer a Christian...Christians never change the world. Disciples do...You're a Kingdom Citizen. You've been brought into the Embassy of God's Kingdom...to gather with Heads of State. We are Ambassadors. And an Ambassador never has his own opinion, but the King's. Jesus said, "I only speak what I hear My Father saying."

Bishop Knox shared on our Kingdom Mandate. Jesus' central message is the Kingdom of God. The Kingdom of God is God's primary purpose, His original intent. The first word of the Kingdom is 'Repent'. We have to align our minds to the original intent of God, because the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand. Jesus came to restore us. To restore is to bring it back to its original place and position. That means Jesus didn't restore us to heaven, because we never fell from heaven. We fell from dominion, and Jesus came to restore us back to that place of rulership, to rule with Him in the place where He has called us.

Also this evening every KNCI Pastor received a copy of "The Kingdom of God – A Compilation of Notes and Outlines by Dr. Levy H. Knox."

On Friday morning Bishop Knox started off with sharing about the importance of relationships and the KNCI network being organic, rather than an organization. "The Kingdom of God is built in trust, and the strategy of the Kingdom is love." We identify the gifts and callings among all of us, fine tune these gifts, and have the commission to go back into our region and change our world together.

Apostle Thrash shared on Truth, and the great need to speak the truth. If the church is going to come into alignment with what the

will of God is, we have to speak the truth as leaders. If leaders don't speak the truth, then the people won't walk in freedom. "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." John 8:32.

There was a double portion on Friday night. First Pastor Hooks spoke on Kingdom Character. Character is the foundation for all aspects of effective leadership. If we are going to represent the King, we should do it in excellence. We are obligated to carry out the commitments we've made. We are to reflect God's character. That means that your word should be you, because you can't separate God from His Word.

Then Pastor Lake brought a prophetic message: "The Oil To Anoint What Is Next, And To Remove What Was." We have to change with the seasons. Now is the time to move into obedience, so we can move into the next. God is disassembling what man has built. He's trying to get things away from you so He can bring you something. You're going through a process, so God can work on your character. So He can trust you with truth. The anointing won't flow if you're waiting in line for position. David was out in the field, taking care of his father's sheep.

"The strength of authentic leadership is integrity." Saturday morning Bishop Knox shared Kingdom Leadership principles that are full of wisdom. After a short break KNCI Pastors came forth, each bringing their unique gift. Hearts were shared and relationships being strengthened. At the end of the sessions communion was being served.

As shared on Friday morning by Bishop Knox, "The Kingdom is the answer, the Power is the authority, and the Glory is the awareness that the answer has come through the authority of the Holy Spirit." We now walk in a greater awareness, as we have gone from Glory to Glory. And we go out to make our world aware! Come, Thy Kingdom! Be done, Thy will!

If there is such a thing as an entrepreneuring spirit, then I would have to say that Sis. Mamie Mackey-Johnson undoubtedly possesses it. Her audacity to believe for the seemingly impossible has always been a choice without options as she reflects back on the many years of working in the field and picking cotton as a young girl. Sis. Mackey-Johnson boldly admits, "I always knew that I desire a better life," and subsequently, it was her intolerance of her condition that fueled the faith that created many business opportunities over the years.

Sis Mackey-Johnson has had the rare privilege of seeing several of her business ideas become a reality. From starting a book-keeping business in 1979, to owning her own baseball team (Bahama Cowboys) in 1985, Sis. Mackey confesses that she has always had a tenacity to believe, and this type of faith led her to what she describes as her heart's passion in 1992. When Sis. Mackey-Johnson heard that a local facility in Mobile, AL, that provided inpatient services to the mentally challenged, was closing it doors, she opened the door of her home.

After several months of serving as the primary care giver to two residents, Sis. Mackey-Johnson states that she knew that she had discovered God's plan for her life, so she excitedly sought God for a name for her new business. As she pondered and prayed, God led her to Revelations 2 and 3, where it talked about the Seven Churches of Asia Minor, and of the seven churches, it was the Church of Philadelphia which is specifically described as the faithful

church. Sis Mackey-Johnson knew that this was what she wanted to be to those she served: faithful.

The House of Philadelphia Center Incorporated, "The house that love built," is a business that has provided services in Mobile County for 26 years. The House of Philadelphia Center Incorporated is an inpatient facility that provides community living and support services for the mentally challenged. The facilities has the capacity of housing 17 residents and is staffed with 10 employees who are trained to provide medical service and activities of daily living to the residents. John Robinson, Sis. Mackey-Johnson 's youngest son, is currently serving as the Director of Operation. Sis. Mackey-Johnson says that an entrepreneur should:

- 1. Determine the type of business you desire to create and the amount of funds needed to start the business.
- 2. Establish a Board of Directors: select specific people who are trustworthy and have good business sense.
- 3. Establish standard guidelines (Policies and Procedures) that govern the way the business functions.
- 4. Operate your business on ethical business principles, because if you compromise your business ethics "one time" then people will expect you to do it again and again.
- 5. Know that It takes about 3 years for a business to become establish, and if the business is not successful, It is not wise to continue investing in something that's not producing a profit. It's time to re-evaluate and re-assess.

Sis. Mackey-Johnson states that Bishop Knox has been a model spiritual father and a great motivator in her life. She considers Living Word Christian Center as her loving family.


media, soon the donations started to flood in.


